

Survey of Voters in Puerto Rico & U.S. Diaspora March 25 – 30, 2024

## Methodology


From March 25 to 30, 2024, IZQ Strategies conducted a survey of likely voters registered in Puerto Rico, and Puerto Rican likely voters registered in the U.S. (diaspora voters) using SMS responses.

The Puerto Rican diaspora voters sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education and voting history. The margin of error is ±4 percentage points and 675 responses were collected.

Responses from voters in Puerto Rico were weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education and partisanship. The margin of error is ±6 percentage points and 362 responses were collected.

All respondents were given the option to take the survey in Spanish, English or a combination of both.


When prompted to choose their top three issues, Puerto Rico voters are most worried about healthcare, corruption and public safety, while voters in the diaspora are most worried about public safety, inflation and corruption.





Question: From this list choose the three issues that worry you the most:


In Puerto Rico, voters support a wide range of progressive issues, and the data suggests that support for access to abortion has grown.


Among voters in the diaspora, there are similar levels of support as in Puerto Rico for most issues, with a notably larger level of support for abortion access.


In terms of economic issues, there is strong opposition to tax breaks for the wealthy, and strong support for increasing taxes on millionaires to help stabilize Puerto Rico's finances. Medicare for All is even more popular in Puerto Rico than in the U.S.







Both voters in Puerto Rico and the diaspora want to see Joe Biden push to reduce violence in Gaza. Voters in Puerto Rico strongly support the local government taking significant action to address femicides.
